Annual Agricultural Museum Open House

The 17th Annual Agricultural Museum Open House will be held on Sunday August 14 between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. at the Agricultural Museum, 501 Old Hwy 26 in Hennepin. Local collectors will be displaying antique tractors and vehicles as usual. The permanent displays are agricultural equipment and tools, wildlife, coal mining and military memorabilia, early 1900s general store, post office, one room school and farm kitchen. The "Crops for College" Tractor Drive hosted by the Marshall-Putnam Farm Bureau's Young Leaders group will also stop at the Ag Museum for lunch, so there will be more tractors on hand than usual.







At 1:00 p.m. Filmmaker Stephen Parry invites audiences to discover the story of a changing America, told through the lens of one of early radio's most popular and influential programs. From the Great Depression through the hardships of World War II, the National Barn Dance celebrated the folk traditions that were fading in an increasingly urbanized America and helped define an identity for a struggling generation. For rural listeners unsure of the future, or for homesick transplants confronting the city, the National Barn Dance served as a touchstone, from its first broadcast in 1924 to its last in 1960. Preceding the success of the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville by nearly two decades, it made Chicago the capital of country music prior to World War II.

Remembering Charles Doty (1924-2016)

Many of you may remember Charles Doty of Princeton from the newspaper coverage in 2014 after he received the Knight of the Legion of Honor medal from the Government of France for his service in World War 2. Charles joined the Putnam County Historical Society at our Annual Meeting April 2, 2011 when he was already 87 years old. He was enthusiastic about the Ag Museum and immediately volunteered his help and also began to donate articles from his extensive collection that he thought would fit in.





By the time of the 2011 Ag Museum Open House he had restored our McCormick-Deering grain binder and donated the mine drill for our coal mine display. Before the 2012 Open House, he gave us the 1835 Van Wickle Excelsior Grain Fan and made for us both a maple syrup tap display and a fencing display. During 2013 he made support bases for our Vollenweider carpenter's bench and



a copper water tank. At the 2013 Open House he gave us the Banner root cutter, a grindstone and a display board of hand-forged wrenches. Before the 2015 Open House he gave us the Peoria end-gate seeder.









Just a week before he died, Charles attended our 2016 Annual Meeting and described a disc gang sharpener he was going to restore and donate. Although he was unable to complete that project, we were able to obtain that



sharpener and several other items of his collection (sickle bar sharpener, single disc sharpener, post drill, picket fence tool) from his estate, including his threshing sledge (tribulum), as a fitting memorial to the memory of a great friend to the Society.
