Ag Museum Open House Sunday August 13

The Annual Agricultural Museum Open House of the Putnam County Historical Society will be held 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Sunday August 13, 2017 at 501 Old Hwy 26, Hennepin. Local collectors will be displaying antique tractors and vehicles as usual. The permanent displays are agricultural equipment and tools, wildlife, coal mining and military memorabilia, early 1900s general store, post office, one-room school and farm kitchen.





At 1:00 p.m. Bob and Jerry Read will give a presentation on the history of the hardware and implement business in Henry begun by Duke Brothers in 1880 and taken over by Read Brothers in 1957. The presentation will be in our new Meeting House adjacent to the Ag Museum.

The Putnam County FFA Alumni will be holding a tractor drive before the Open House to raise funds for the Bill Biagi Memorial FFA Alumni Scholarship. Registration for the Tractor Drive will begin at 9:00 a.m. at the Ag Museum. The tractors will depart at 10:00 a.m. and return at 12:30 p.m. for lunch. Cost of the drive is \$40.00

Hennepin to Celebrate Bicentennial

Hennepin will be celebrating its Bicentennial in conjunction with Harvest Home on the weekend of September 22-24. The location of the Village of Hennepin was not decided until the Illinois Legislature recreated Putnam County in 1831 and specified Hennepin as the County Seat. However, Hennepin bases its birth on the year 1817, when the Hartzell trading post (presumed to be the first non-native building in Putnam County) was built on the north edge of the future village.
