VOTER REGISTRATION TO BE HELD AT PUTNAM COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL

Putnam County Clerk and Election Authority, Dan Kuhn, would like to inform the county's residents that he will be at the Putnam County High School from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 5th for the purpose of registering any individual that is eligible to vote. The voter registration will be open to the public and to any students that will turn 18 years of age prior to the February 2nd Primary Election.

"Voting is your most fundamental right as an American and should never be taken for granted. Exercise your freedom . . . register and VOTE!"

You must be registered to be eligible to vote on February 2, 2010

- ✓ Any person who will be 18 years old by the day of the General Primary Election on Tuesday, February 2nd may register through Tuesday, January 5th;
- ✓ A registered voter who has changed her name by marriage or otherwise, must re-register;
- ✓ A registered voter who has moved within the County of Putnam must change his or her address;
- ✓ A new resident of the County must register in Putnam County in order to vote in Putnam County.

Registration may be made with the Putnam County Clerk at the Courthouse in Hennepin or with local deputy registrars. (Names of the local deputy registrars in your home area can be obtained by contacting the County Clerk's office in Hennepin at 925-7129.) The Putnam County Courthouse is open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The County Clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, January 2nd from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon for voter registration only.

Memorial services were December 19 in United Church of Christ, Granville. Cremation rites were accorded.

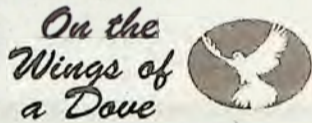
